



THE 1995 RESTATEMENT OF

THE OATH OF HIPPOCRATES

I SWEAR in the presence of the Almighty and before my family, my teachers and my peers that according to my ability and judgment I will keep this oath and stipulation:

TO RECKON all who have taught me this art equally dear to me as my parents and in the same spirit and dedication to impart a knowledge of the art of medicine to others. I will continue with diligence to keep abreast of advances in medicine. I will treat without exception all who seek my ministrations, so long as the treatment of others is not compromised thereby, and I will seek the counsel of particularly skilled physicians where indicated for the benefit of my patient.

I WILL FOLLOW that method of treatment which according to my ability and judgment, I consider for the benefit of my patient and abstain from whatever is harmful or mischievous. I will neither prescribe nor administer a lethal dose of medicine to any patient even if asked nor counsel any such thing nor perform act or omission with direct intent deliberately to end a human life. I will maintain the utmost respect for every human life from fertilization to natural death and reject abortion that deliberately takes a unique human life.

WITH PURITY, HOLINESS, AND BENEFICENCE I will pass my life and practice my art. Except for the prudent correction of imminent danger, I will neither treat any patient nor carry out any research on any human being without the valid informed consent of the subject or the appropriate legal protector thereof, understanding that research must have as its purpose the furtherance of the health of that individual. Into whatever patient setting I enter, I will go for the benefit of the sick and will abstain from every voluntary act of mischief or corruption and also from the seduction of any patient.

WHATEVER IN CONNECTION with my professional practice or not in connection with it I may see or hear in the lives of my patients which ought not be spoken abroad I will not divulge, reckoning that all such should be kept secret.

WHILE I CONTINUE to keep this oath unviolated may it be granted to me to enjoy life and the practice of the art and science of medicine with the blessing of the Almighty and respected by my peers and society, but should I trespass and violate this Oath, may the reverse be my lot.

CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

"As the family goes, so goes the nation, and so goes the world in which we live." This prophetic quote from Pope John Paul II sets the theme for the Catholic Medical Association's 2017 Annual Education Conference. In answering the call to the vocation of medicine, physicians and other health care professionals have the privilege and responsibility of caring for fellow human beings in various stages of illness and health. However, patients are not merely "broken bodies" in need of fixing. Catholic medical professionals recognize each person as, "made in the image of God," with an immortal soul that animates the body and makes visible God's real presence in the world. Catholic medicine guides those in the healing professions in restoring the integrity of the body and soul to allow individuals to fulfill their God-given vocation.

Often overlooked in our care for the patient is their relationship with spouse, family, and friends. Patients are simultaneously individuals and in relationship: son, daughter, husband, wife, mother, father, and friend. No relationship is more fundamental to the health of individuals and society than that of marriage and family. Described

by Pope John Paul II as, "The School of Love," family is where individuals learn to express and receive love of God and neighbor. As the fundamental "cell of society," families educate, nurture, support, & socialize individuals for society. When medicine is at the service of the patient AND their marriages and families, medical professionals can change the family, the nation, and the world in which we live.

There is a significant breakdown of the family today. Medical professionals have a unique opportunity to support and strengthen the family. Over a million children experience divorce of their parents each year in the United States. This is roughly half of the annual number of children born into married households. Creating stronger families and marriages leads to better health outcomes by supporting the whole person physically, psychologically, intellectually and spiritually. This conference will address many aspects of families from marriages, children and society as well as concrete ways that healthcare professionals can better support families, marriages, children and society as a whole.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVE

After attending this conference, a participant should be able to:

- 1. Understand the Creighton Model System, NaPro Technology, the Marquette Model of Natural Family Planning and discuss the various biological markers to obtain pertinent information on the phases of fertility and infertility, and the state of the woman's procreative and gynecological health.
- 2. Differentiate human emotions and their role in human acts, specifically in the patient-physician relationship. Formulate for medical professionals the principles of Christian anthropology that explain the relationship of the human body and soul. Included is the significance of the identification of the human being as a "person" and its applicability to healthcare professionals.
- 3. Understand the effects of burnout on the physician, their loved ones and their patients. Explain how seeing the profession of medicine as a "calling" contributes to physician well-being and how developing leadership skills in the CMA increases a sense of professional accomplishment and career satisfaction, which are important tactics for preventing/treating burnout. Describe Life Centered Mentoring and how to integrate it into your medical practice.
- 4. Better understand how the family is the basic unit and building block of society and fundamental to the life of the society, and how marriage supports the institution of the family and how healthcare providers can contribute to the health of families by contributing the health of individual members, including their spiritual health, and by encouraging families to stay together. Understand the effects that contraception, abortion, addiction, same sex attraction and pornography have on marriage, family and society.
- 5. Better understand End-of-Life issues regarding family, the elderly, conscience rights, Catholic teaching, nutrition and hydration, suffering and the role of physician/nurse/healthcare provider during this journey.
- 6. Better understand how medical practice is shaped by epistemology, history and the different analogies of a physician as scientist, technician, teacher, gardener and servant. Identify strategies that help Catholic physicians and medical providers do their work consistent with Catholic values and teaching.

Solidarity HealthShare is a Healthcare Sharing Ministry, which provides an ethical way to fund health care costs while protecting and practicing our Catholic beliefs. Solidarity's members pay a monthly contribution and members submit their medical needs as they arise.
